Financial Help When Somebody Dies

When someone close to you dies, you might it find it difficult to deal with things. Never be afraid to ask for help and remember: financial assistance from the Government might be available, but you will need to make a claim in order to receive it.

Paying for a funeral

- Do you have access to enough cash?
- Are you able to access the deceased's bank account?
- Did the deceased arrange life assurance or a funeral plan?
- Was the deceased or their partner receiving benefits?

If the deceased didn't leave enough money you may be entitled to a Social Fund Funeral Payment (www.dwp.gov.uk)

Other financial help

If your husband, wife or civil partner has died recently and you meet certain conditions you may get a Bereavement Payment of £2,000 up to 12 months after a death. You might also be able to receive ongoing help in the form of either:

- Widowed Parent's Allowance, or
- Bereavement Allowance

How to claim bereavement benefits

- Fill in form BD8 which you will get when you register a death. Send the form to Jobcentre Plus. They will send you a claim form BB1

- You can phone for a claim form: Tel: 0845 608 8602 or 0845 608 8634
